We hope you have adapted to our new way of celebrating Mass. At this stage we continue to have a capacity of 65 in the church and 25 in the hall. If you are not feeling well or are not comfortable being around so many people, we encourage you to stay home and watch via Livestream. If you come to Mass you need to wear a mask, and someone will take your temperature and instruct you where to sit. Communion will be distributed only in the hand. We have new hand sanitizing dispensers, but we encourage you to bring your own sanitizer and use it after touching any surfaces. We will not be holding hands during the Our Father or hugging during the Sign of Peace. If the church and hall are at capacity you may sit in your car or in the Sister Karen Garden until Communion. Care for Creation

We were honored to receive a beautiful certificate from the St. Kateri Conservation Center for becoming a St. Kateri Habitat. It is mounted by the St. Kateri statue in church. Youth Group Corner : We had a very nice Youth Group meeting this past Sunday. We had prayer and completed an in-home scavenger hunt. The youth enjoyed that activity. The Teen meeting for those that attended Convention, was also productive. Thank you letters will be going to all the area hospitals for the healthcare workers on the frontline. Ride for Roswell: although the Ride for Roswell to raise funds for cancer research has been modified due to Covid-19, Fr. Jud will still be riding about 44 miles on Grand Island on August 8 with a smaller number of socially distanced riders. He'll also walk his bike over the South Grand Island bridge, despite his fear of heights and tall bridges, as a sign of solidarity with all those who fear an upcoming cancer treatment. Family Promise Renovated! You may have noticed a lot of commotion around the Sister Karen building lately. Well, construction is finally wrapping up on a major model shift for Family Promise of WNY. Remember before how homeless families had to sleep overnight at different churches across Erie County? Well, it turns out this rotational model was not lining up with best practices of trauma-informed care. Family Promise wanted to do the best we possibly could for our families, which included the stability of housing them in one place during the trauma of homelessness. In 2019, we completed an over \$200,000 capital campaign which we have spent making critical renovations to the former parish school to rezone it from school to residential. Changes include creating 6 family units, multiple bathrooms and showers, a sprinkler system and all new furniture. We are showcasing our building in July before we reopen intakes for families in August. If you have a second and want to stop by, we'll happily give you a tour (with masks)! — Peace, Lu Firestone
